With humility we convey our warmest greetings and salutations from Africans Rising for Justice, Peace and Dignity and the peoples of the continent of Africa.

Africans Rising for Justice, Peace and Dignity is a rapidly growing collective of social movements, NGOs, popular social justice efforts, faith based groups, trade unions, journalists, intellectuals, artists, athletes, cultural activists and many other people across the continent and diaspora working to build Pan-African solidarity.

We are writing to you at a critical moment of our history as we are experiencing an unprecedented public health emergency due to COVID-19. This gesture will not only respect their rights to safe and healthy lives, it will help stop the spread of COVID-19 in communities across your country.
